JOSHUA GRFINER

Joshua Greiner is a Fort Collins native and Poudre School District alumni, attending Olander, Blevins, and Rocky Mountain High School. Growing up in Fort Collins, he learned a love for the outdoors through mountain biking, hiking, camping, skiing, and playing disc golf. Joshua started learning the Cello at Blevins Middle School and has been in love with all things Orchestra and music ever since.



He received his Undergraduate degree from Colorado State University in Music Education, Cello Performance, and Cello

Pedagogy in December 2019. Mr. Greiner has experience teaching students across Northern Colorado from beginners to advanced, state recognized ensembles. In addition to teaching, Mr. Greiner has performed with his quartet throughout Northern Colorado.

This year is Mr. Greiner's second year teaching Orchestra at Preston Middle School, starting in August of 2020. Although primarily a clarinetist, Mr. Mendizabal studied and played viola, piano, and harpsichord while at CSU to supplement his string education.

Mr. Mendizabal was raised in Las Vegas, Nevada and attended the University of Nevada, Reno for his Bachelor of Music

Education. HIs passion for band and orchestra led him to pursue an education degree while studying privately with the Director of Orchestras, Dr. Jason Altieri. Mr. Mendizabal held leadership roles in both the Marching Band as Drum Major for four years, and as President of Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity for two years.

Mr. Mendizabal is excited to join the Northern Colorado Youth Orchestra's conducting staff. He currently serves as the Instrumental Director at Ridgeview Classical Schools for 5th-12th grade band and orchestra. In addition to this new post, he works with Leslie Stewart and the Health and Wellness orchestra as the Assistant Conductor. He strives to make a difference in the music community of the next generation with an emphasis on diversity in the orchestra.

Outside of music, Mr. Mendizabal enjoys spending quality time with his dog son, Rocky Mendizabal. He enjoys watching Spanish and Korean films and series, swimming, cooking, and indulging in hot cups of green tea.

Kris just retired after thirty-six years in education in the public schools. Her last 11 years of teaching were at Preston Middle School in Fort Collins, Colorado as the Orchestra Director. She also served as the Assistant Honor Orchestra Director for Poudre School District. Kris' early teaching experiences were for Weld County School District 6 as both an elementary music teacher and on orchestra teacher at the middle school level. She also taught in the Lincoln Public Schools in Lincoln, Nebraska for 14 years in both elementary and middle school as an orchestra director. While living in Nebraska, Kris had the privilege of writing orchestra music reviews for the Nebraska Music Educator Journal for several years.



As a violinist, Kris has played professionally for the Greeley Philharmonic Orchestra, the Greeley Chamber Orchestra, the Lincoln Symphony Orchestra, the Nebraska Chamber Orchestra, the Cheyenne Symphony Orchestra, the Fort Collins Symphony Orchestra, the Larimer Chorale Orchestra and the Classic String Quartet. She has played with the likes of Doc Severinsen, Michael Bublé, Quincy Jones, Gladys Knight, Patty Austin, James Ingram, Kenny G, Kansas, and for the rock band Styx. Kris has also had the opportunity to sing with the Larimer Chorale in Fort Collins, Colorado, as well as the Die Meistersingers in Omaha, Nebraska. Currently she freelances in the Northern Colorado area and is currently a member of the Hallmark Duo (harp and violin), and String Quartet Con Brio.

Kristin enjoys her family and is very involved with them. Her husband, Don, is the former Superintendent of Weld County RE1 School District. Don recently retired as a Project Director with MGT Consulting and the Adams 14 School District as Interim Superintendent and is now doing consulting work in education.
